AMBASSADOR COLLEGE UPDATE

(Pasadena Campus)

Ambassador College is now back in full swing after the Feast. This week's classes will end the first quarter of the college year--i.e. will bring us to the mid-semester point.

It was encouraging to many of us faculty members to meet and talk with you ministers during the Feast of Tabernacles period. We are always happy to have your input concerning the college, and are also happy to explain what is happening at Ambassador College.

We were very encouraged to see that the "Festival '81" film shown was well received at all Feast sites. Mr. Armstrong recently told me that he really enjoyed "Festival '81." We are, in fact, now in the planning stages of next year's "Festival '82." Yesterday, Ellis LaRavia, Joe Tkach, Larry Omasta, Ross Jutsum and a few others of us got together to discuss various points relative to the production of next year's festival film. This is quite a production and requires much thoughtful planning, scheduling, etc.

We had a very good response to the 1981 ENVOY. We have already sold approximately 13,000 copies. We still have a number of orders to fill. Plans are now being made to publish a 1982 ENVOY which, with more direct input from Mr. Armstrong, should be even better than this year's ENVOY.

Recently, I received an encouraging letter from Mr. C. S. Kelly (Festival Elder in Malaysia) regarding the input of the Ambassador College students during the Feast. The third group of Ambassador College students are now nearing the completion of their six-month's stint of teaching duty in Thailand. They have been teaching English to the refugees, and also have been imparting knowledge concerning Western culture. This will enable the refugees to adapt more easily when they are relocated in a Western nation--mostly in English-speaking countries.

I thought it might be worthwhile to include in the PGR a portion of Mr. Kelly's post-Feast letter to me--a letter in which he praised the good example of the Ambassador College students who attended the Malaysian Feast of Tabernacles:

The main purpose of this letter is to let you know how much I feel that the students from Thailand contributed to that turnaround.

They were true Ambassadors.

Many commented on their involvement in special music, the assistance they gave with children's games on the Family Evening, and their enthusiastic involvement in all the activities. They also went to

pains to include the local brethren in activities they themselves organised during free afternoons and evenings.

Their example has gone a long way in removing the former false impressions of Pasadena and Ambassador College which were spread by some actively trying to destroy the Church here.

It is likely that the students themselves did not realise the value of their example or just how deeply they affected the brethren here. The Churches here consist of mainly young people. For some, this Feast gave them the inspiration to stay in God's Church. For others, their interest in Ambassador College has been stirred.

This afternoon, Mr. Armstrong called a meeting of the Advisory Council of Elders to consider various matters. He plans to depart for his Mideast trip tomorrow, Wednesday, November 11th. He continues to maintain a very busy schedule of meetings, telecasts, letters and articles, Bible studies, sermons, etc. We all marvel at the way he continues to keep up such a hectic pace, but when we reflect on how he is able to do this, we are always reminded of Isaiah's prophecy:

The everlasting God, the LORD, the Creator...giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might he increaseth strength. Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall: But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint (Isa. 40:28-31).

May God continue to bless and strengthen all of you, His faithful ministers, as you diligently serve Him to the utmost of your ability.

International News

German Area Update The 1981 Feast of Tabernacles was held at the sites of Bonndorf, in West Germany's famed "Black Forest" and Brno, Czechoslovakia.

As at other Feast sites around the world, God truly poured out His Spirit of harmony and love on these locations. Visiting English-speaking Feastgoers were also a wonderful addition to these Feast sites. Everyone attending noticed the festive, joyous and edifying unity of the "greatest Feast ever."

Total attendance was 745 at Bonndorf and 245 at Brno, which represents a 37% increase in attendance over 1980. The total offering from both sites amounted to DM 97,226 (\$44,193), which reflects an increase of 33% over last year. Also, eight people were baptized at this year's Feast.

On October 19, during this year's Feast, Germany's well-known news magazine, DER SPIEGEL, published a full-page ad with a glued-on postcard advertising The PLAIN TRUTH magazine in five languages. Already by November fifth we had received 16,430 requests for The PLAIN TRUTH magazine in one of the five languages. Based on previous ads in DER SPIEGEL, we now estimate a total of 20,000 to 24,000 requests by the end of January 1982.

New Zealand/Pacific News All four Feast sites in this part of the world reported an exceptionally profitable and inspiring Feast of Tabernacles--unquestionably the best Feast ever! The registration figures were as follows:

Brethren in Tonga were able to hear Mr. Armstrong's First Holy Day message live by means of an international telephone hookup, and brethren in the other three sites received the message by videotape. Visiting U.S. minister, Mr. Richard Rice, spoke at the Rotorua and Queenstown sites, and his inspiring sermons were greatly appreciated. Regional Director, Mr. Peter Nathan, was able to attend the Rotorua, Queenstown and Fiji sites. The sermons given by God's ministers provided a magnificent spiritual feast, and excellent weather in all sites helped make the Feast physically uplifting as well.

Offerings on the two Holy Days posted increases of 29.9% and 25.7% respectively, bringing the combined total for all the 1981 Holy Day offerings to an increase of 32.6% over the 1980 figure.

Meanwhile, back in Auckland, mail kept coming into the office. During October, 6,000 items were received in response to our newspaper flyers advertising The PLAIN TRUTH. This promotion has now been completed and replaced by a new thrust comprising full-page, full-color PLAIN TRUTH ads in THE NEW ZEALAND LISTENER, THE NEW ZEALAND WOMAN'S WEEKLY and the local edition of TIME magazine. Responses to these ads are just beginning to come in.

PUBLISHING SERVICES UPDATE

As another dynamic and eventful year in God's Work swiftly nears completion, PLAIN TRUTH circulation continues to skyrocket! More new subscribers have been added to the computer files in the first ten months of 1981 than in any other single year in the history of the Work! The PLAIN TRUTH is growing so rapidly in circulation that we now rank among the top circulation magazines in the country. Currently, we are the 18th largest in worldwide circulation, just behind TIME magazine (4.4 million).

Our church members in the United States have done an extremely impressive and admirable job in contributing to this dramatic rise in circulation growth. Already, in 1981, newsstand circulation in the U.S. has risen 44%! Members are distributing 515,000 more magazines per month now than they did at the beginning of the year.

Members have telephoned over 400,000 libraries and waiting rooms (adding 100,000 of these to the subscription file) and have distributed almost 1,000,000 card-holder cards (adding 31,000 new subscriptions).

Mr. Armstrong is pleased with all circulation programs now in progress. Please relay our thanks to all the brethren in your congregations involved in these programs. Many new developments are in store for 1982. Hold on to your hats--it looks like a tremendous new year ahead!

Newsstand Program Inspires Involvement in Work

Mr. Steven Botha, Pastor of the Charleston, Parkersburg and Huntington, West Virginia Church areas recently sent the following memo to Mr. Joseph Tkach of Ministerial Services:

Warmest greetings from West Virginia! Thought you might be interested in something I have noticed in the new Church in Huntington, West Virginia.

Over the years I have had the privilege of starting several new Churches. Most seem to take some time to develop their own "identity" as a Church congregation. The Huntington Church, in contrast, has developed an identity very quickly. There seems to be a tremendous sense of camaraderie and friendship, even though the people came from three previous Church areas.

I began wondering why this is and concluded that one factor was The PLAIN TRUTH newsstand program.

Weekly Radio Response Increases

Since the latter half of July, the Work's toll-free number has been given on the radio broadcast. As a result, the number of calls received has continued to climb. From July through September, radio response averaged 130 calls per week. However, the response in October nearly tripled! We received 370 calls per week, which is a 185% increase over the previous weeks.

Various factors undoubtedly contributed to this encouraging increase. One was that prophetic booklets were offered, such as THE UNITED STATES AND BRITAIN IN PROPHECY and THE BOOK OF REVELATION UNVEILED AT LAST. In addition, listeners may be getting accustomed to hearing the telephone number and therefore are more inclined to call. There is also a normal response increase at this time of the year following the summer. Also, since September twice as many radio stations carry the WATS number.
